We care about each other.





The eastern most wing is home to our Life Skills program and our second and third grade classrooms, with the western hall (featured here) as the fourth and fifth graders' learning home. As a Positive Behavior Supports school, our philosophy is one where we build relationship, we teach desired expectations, including citizenship, kindness, patience, friendship, inclusiveness, participation, upstanding, acceptance and more. We celebrate our students when they exhibit these behaviors and we encourage them individually as well as class/school-wide, with activities and acknowledgments. Research and experience has shown that it is more effective to acknowledge desired behaviors and provide choices than it is to punish. If consequences do occur, they are designed to be discreet, developmentally appropriate, right-sized, and in partnership with our families. We all have "oopses" from time to time as we learn new rules and expectations, but we are still a school family!

Where we learn together...




We start our days with Morning Meeting, which is an effort to build community, check in, and establish relationships - and a positive class-family culture.
